HERE IS WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE ROTARY LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE - RLI

What is RLI?

he Rotary Leadership Institute was founded in 1992, some 30 years ago, by PRID David Linett, to assist in improving the Rotary knowledge and leadership skills of the future leaders of our Rotary clubs through a

quality training and educational experience. To date, the RLI training program has spread to more than 400 Rotary International Districts in

numerous countries over the six Continents because local clubs recognize the importance of training future leaders.

The Rotary Leadership Institute is an unofficial affiliate of Rotary International, but not an official program of RI nor under its control. Many Past RI Presidents are supporting the RLI program and has encouraged Rotary districts to participate the RLI program.

RLI Mission Statement

The mission of the Rotary Leadership Institute is to provide an up-to-date, practical, and user-friendly educational opportunity in convenient locations for Rotarians identified as potential leaders by their club officers. Courses are given to foster leadership skills and Rotary knowledge with the intent to motivate the participant to be enthusiastic, creative and dedicated Rotarians.

Why Do We Need a Leadership Institute?

The Institute

offers a leadership

course in 3 full day

sessions (Parts 1, 11

& 111)."

Leadership skills in a voluntary organization are often different than business leadership skills.

It is important that club leaders have every opportunity for Rotary general education because the success or failure of our clubs primarily depends on the quality of their club leaders.

Membership growth is dependent on the quality of Rotary clubs, as clubs with

good leadership are more likely to involve their members in exciting service activities and programs and, consequently, to retain their members and attract new ones.

The Institute offers a leadership course in three full day sessions (Parts I, II & III). Those completing each part are eligible for the next part. The courses are designed to provide Rotary knowledge and develop leadership skills for voluntary organizations.

What is the Philosophy of RLI?

RLI believes that having leadership skills does not alone assure good Rotary leadership. An effective Rotary leader must alsohave Rotary knowledge, perspective about where Rotary has been, where it is now and a vision of what Rotary can be.

What are the Methods of Facilitating RLI?

Course sessions are structured with as much discussion/ participation as possible. Methods also include discussion groups, role-playing and problem-solving.

Class size is usually 12-18





participants. Lectures are strictly limited. An RLI course workbook is provided to each attendee.

Who are the faculty members?

The faculty members are carefully selected by the Institute for their teaching abilities. They are drawn from all areas of our district and occasionally from outside our district. Many are present and past district governors, assistant governors, successful past presidents who have previously attended the RLI Faculty Orientation course and with experience in special areas.

Each new faculty member must attend an initial full day RLI faculty orientation training program and various periodic reorientation programs. The results of evaluations help the Institute to improve the course content and instruction.

Who Should Attend RLI?

Although any Rotarian may attend RLI courses, RLI recommends that clubs encourage Rotarians who have the potential for future club leadership, not necessarily just club presidents, to attend.

The ideal candidate is early in their Rotary career and has a strong interest in Rotary and is prepared to be exposed to the larger world of Rotary outside of their club.



Superstition and witchcraft keeping Ugandans poor

any years ago, a car carrier was parked on the side of the road that connects Kireka to Kyaliwajjala on the outskirts of Kampala. The car carrier, comprising of a truck head and trailer seemed to be still in good working conditions.

Days turned into weeks, months and years with the truck still in its position, on the pavement facing the direction of Kireka. Nobody seemed to know the owner of the truck though some alleged it belonged to an entrepreneur who had died in the infamous "balance the boat" accident of a few years ago.

If you used a boda boda along this route, the rider would tell you all sorts of stories — that the truck speaks at night—like a human being and can even call out your name. That it was a sanctuary of all Uganda's spirits. The truck was not only an eyesore, it had become a

road safety hazard.

Last Saturday, a young man involved in the Kampala auto show perhaps in a bid to promote his upcoming event decided to do something. Working with UNRA, he brought in a team of mechanics that knew how to disengage it and

away.

One of Uganda's leading television stations sent in a crew for live coverage. Journalists from

many media houses arrived in droves to cover a truck being towed away. A bigger breathless crowd waited on X (formerly Twitter) in apparent anticipation of what may happen making it one of the most trending topics on the social networking platform in Uganda.

Within about five hours. the truck had been disengaged and was able to be towed away. People formed small groups and wondered in whispers whether the crew won't be struck at night while others drove by in the morning to confirm the truck didn't return by itself in the night. The truck didn't have selfdriving capabilities.

Ironically, all this happened nearly a stone's throw away from the Uganda Martyrs Shrine in Namugongo, a testament of Uganda's belief in Christianity and confirmation of people's beliefs in the underworld. Anyway, Ugandans seems to be very spiritual. Christianity or even the Uganda martyrs didn't take away their other beliefs.

The wide belief in the truck being a sanctuary for the spirits also showed one of the reasons we are poor. Many people spend most of their time praying instead of working. Every little challenge is prayed for. Visits to the witchdoctor's office are organized on a daily. There are even taxi stages in Kampala known to lead to shrines. You have heard of Stage v'Abakyala. Western embassies accredited to Uganda claim that people submit paper applications for visas spread with blood, birth feathers and other fetishes.

Almost every business that fails is blamed on witchcraft of the neighbours or some stepmother or co-wife. At workplaces, many people don't greet others, shake hands or come in close contact with others in fear of witchcraft.

A person who succeeds at work is believed to have performed juju on the boss.

At one stage, a musician was alleged to have got his wealth and fame by making regular visits to the Lake Victoria floor. He got cheeky and released a song about it, thereby making more money from those who were spreading the rumor.

Conmen send messages of how the illuminati can make you wealthy if you paid them a connection fee. The reason such conmen exist is because people believe in the illuminati. The illuminati in Uganda is euphemism for witchcraft.

We hear that some national sports teams sometimes have a witchdoctor on retainer yet the performance never improves. Kids are sacrificed every day in search of wealth.

Those seeking for love or a pregnancy spend countless nights at premises of witches. Witchdoctors are usually poor so how can they then make one rich if they can't do it for themselves? Don't they want to


At hospitals, especially the public ones, representatives of witchdoctors set up bases where they encourage patients with chronic illnesses to discharge themselves so that
