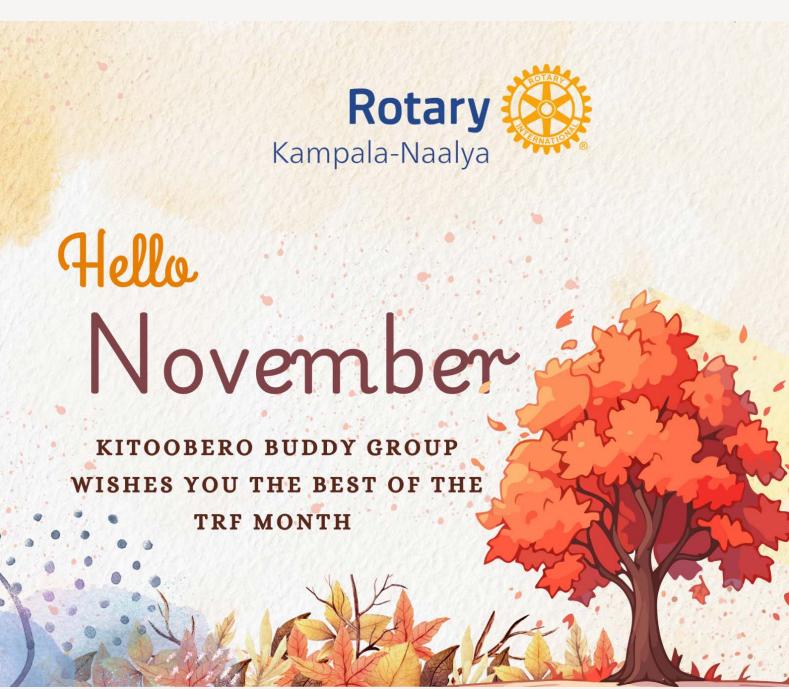

Scaling Our Impact through The Rotary Foundation

Dear Rotarians,

would like to share some thoughts on an important topic that has been discussed in our Rotary community: how can we scale our impact through larger, more significant projects?

My daughter, who works in digital marketing, collaborated with an agency where her responsibilities included identifying influencers to promote various products. Each time they launched a new product, she would ask for my input on potential influencers.

However, her final decisions were always guided by their brand and digital footprint—specifically, their number of followers which demonstrates their reach and effectiveness.

This trend underscores a crucial truth in today's world: numbers matter.

In Rotary, we have been discussing how to increase our impact by undertaking bigger, better, and bolder projects. Many clubs are engaged in wonderful initiatives that touch lives. Unfortunately, many of these efforts go unnoticed. Currently, many of our projects rely on member donations at club level and fundraising events. However, through this approach, we can only raise limited amounts at a time. This subsequently leads to longer timelines for project implementation and projects

that are relatively small in scope. Our limited reach subsequently affects our

visibility, which in turn constrains our ability to attract significant partnerships. In the corporate world, scale matters.

Yet, there is a way to break this cycle. The Rotary Foundation was

established in 1917 with the objective of enabling us to do good in the world. What began as a modest investment of \$26.50 has grown into an endowment with over \$1.6 billion. Each year, the Rotary Foundation awards over \$300 million in grants; with projects in D9213 receiving an average of \$2.5 million.

In essence, the foundation was created to help us scale our efforts by providing the resources to reach more people. This objective remains as relevant today as ever. The smallest grant available is \$30,000—an amount that is

often beyond what clubs can fundraise locally. Yet, its potential impact on any given community is significant.

So I am encouraging you to do the maths. Take a moment to calculate how many wo(man)hours your club spends organizing fundraisers compared to the potential return on investment if we directed those efforts towards applying for grants from the Rotary Foundation.

While it's true that crafting proposals and finding international partners can be time-consuming, the difference between a Global Grant and club funding is profound.

RI President Stephanie has set an ambitious Rotary Endowment goal of \$2.025 billion by 30 June 2025, which will empower us to increase our global impact. The more funds we raise, the more we can give back. But this task will be more manageable if more of us contribute to the Foundation.

On July 1 2024, I launched the 25 X 25 TRF Relay with an ambitious goal of all giving clubs and all giving Rotarians. My humble request is that every Rotarian in D9213 contributes a minimum of \$25 dollars (UGX 100,000) to the Rotary Foundation by 30 June 2025. I would like to thank in a special way, all the clubs and the individuals that have heeded this call. If you haven't started your relay- it is not yet too late.

Use the month of November to amplify the magic of Rotary by giving something to the Foundation. All contributions matter!

he Rotary Foundation (TRF) is a not-for-profit organization and is supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotary Members and friends of the foundation who share its vision for a better world. This support is essential to make projects funded with TRF grants become sustainable and improve our communities. The TRF grants support activities like

- Polio Plus eradication initiatives,
- Rotary Peace fellowships, for individuals to pursue studies in international relations, peace and conflict resolutions;
- District grants to enable Rotary clubs and districts to address immediate

needs in the communities and abroad,

- Scholarships for undergraduate or graduate studies in any area of focus
- Vocational training teams.
- Global grants to offer Rotary Clubs and Districts opportunities to participate in strategically high impact activities in the seven areas.

According to the Rotary Calendar, the month of November is dedicated to the Rotary foundation. It's a time we reflect on our giving to support the works of the foundation as well as recognize those who give to the foundation in any amount. There are several ways to give to The Rotary Foundation in alignment with your personal preferences and capacity.

1. Direct Online Contributions -

Through Rotary International Official Website, individuals can make one time or recurring donations to specific areas such as Annual fund, Polio Plus fund or Endowment fund. The process is simple, secure and instant recognition for donations like:

- Polio Plus donations whereby donors can give any amount to the Polio fund
- Every Rotarian, Every Year (EREY) encourages every member to make a personal contribution of \$100 to the Annual Fund every year.
- Paul Harris Fellow Recognitions whereby Rotarians commit to donate \$1000 dollars or more in a single donation or cumulatively.
- Major gifts whereby major donors contribute \$10,000 or more over a time,

- 2. Giving through Endowments and Bequests: Do you have some assets you would want to bequeath to TRF? You can become a benefactor or a Bequest Society Member through bequeathing, securities, real estates of assets totaling to \$10,000 or more. By including The Rotary Foundation in your will or estate plans, you can leave a lasting legacy even after your lifetime.
- 3. Donations through our Rotary Club: Our club has goal to raise to raise \$2000 towards the polio fund. In case you are not considering the direct online donations option, this is a another quick way to donate to TRF through your club. Any amount can be sent to the club treasurer.
- **4. TRF Fundraisers:** RC Kampala Naalya participates in TRF fundraisers organized by the district. In the past we have participated

through buying tickets for the TRF fundraising and recognition dinner. The TRF recognition dinner be held in January 2025. However, the District came up with an innovative way to give to TRF. The 25x25 TRF challenge encourages members to give \$25 (100,000) by the year 2025. You can donate right away by clicking https://25by25.jengo.com/. Your donation will reflect on you on your account

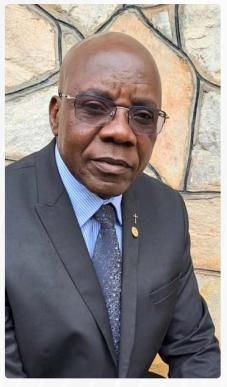
Being a Rotarian authenticates the person and their business or profession.

f you take care of an elderly person in Uganda today, there are many challenges that you face. You may have to quit your job to look after an elderly person and there is no pay for that or you may have to get the services of a live-in nurse. Both options are expensive and almost out of reach for the majority of people.

So the elderly who usually don't have sufficient sources of income live lives devoid of dignity, many sometimes scavenging for meals and other things that they need in their lives. The politicians who claim to represent the citizens are largely out of touch.

The example of the diapers the elderly require to live decent lives is a case in point. Last year, Parliament approved taxes on diapers. The Members of Parliament voted with unprecedented euphoria with many arguing that they were doing so to stop homosexuals from using them. There was no data presented to

prove that the majority of adult diapers were being used by homosexuals. But nothing unites politicians in Uganda than homosexuality!

Anyone who argued otherwise was labelled a supporter of homosexuality is not or to having been paid it is also by the "imperialists" in bed so western capitals to corrupt the mind of Ugandans.

If you are in care today of an elderly person today, you would have noticed that you are spending

a lot of time moving from one shop in Kikuubo to another in search of adult diapers. With increment in taxes, the traders who were stocking them have moved on to more profitable products or closed their businesses all together.

Those who bring them increased the costs to cater for the increased taxes but they are also bringing in smaller sizes and somewhat inferior qualities

than before the taxes were slapped on them. Those who haven't moved on, are doing what they are doing to keep their businesses open. Who would blame them?

A diaper a size too small is not only uncomfortable, it is also said to lead to bed sores. **If you have**

ever looked after a sick person, bed sores are some of the most painful and stubborn things to treat. Caregivers want to do anything in the world to avoid them

but small size diapers the elderly are using today are going to create a massive healthcare problem.

And to make it worse, the traders aren't bringing in enough quantities. Today, diapers for the elderly are for booking by paying in advance and you can't be certain when they will bring them in. For some traders, they don't even allow you to book a lot so that everyone gets some.

Of course, the war in the Middle East may also be responsible for delayed shipping of containers but the major reasons Kikuubo traders attribute to the scarcity of adult diapers is the increment in taxes.

Whoever knew that because of our lack of research before we increase taxes, the elderly who are lucky enough to afford pampers will have to use ones that are rationed? But that is where we are.

Today, those who take care of the elderly are spending more money on shoes as they develop holes in the soles as they look for pampers instead of looking for money to buy them

and pay for fees for medical consultancy and prescribed drugs.

pampers were promoting homosexuality because some of them realized their mistakes. I remember seeing a clip where a Member of Parliament after failing to secure diapers

for her mother admitted to having voted to pass the adult diaper law in error. Since to err is human, we shouldn't blame the MPs when they admit their mistake and go ahead and correct them. Because that is the right thing to do.

But also, such glaring mistakes are avoidable by parliament and all arms of government by being informed by data instead of emotions before making key decisions.

It should not be so difficult for the research arm of parliament to find out who buys more adult diapers and for what purpose. The ministries of finance, gender, and health should have this information too.

But the right thing to ensure the elderly live with dignity is to remove the increased taxes on diapers while also supporting local manufacturers to make them here.

KNOWING YOUR MEASURE

There are people in life who labour under **ignorant**

confidence. This is a delusional myopic window that easily casts ignorance as wisdom.

I am certain you have met people who are very sure about their abilities, to the puzzlement of those around them who tend to see (quite rightly) otherwise. Such individuals may apply themselves to tasks with no qualification be it physical, emotional or intellectual until their hubris catches up with them. They even Carry crowns of I know it all, perfecting whoever does not equate to their expectations.

The danger of not knowing your measure is that you may miss out on opportunities, counsel and impartations because you feel too high and mighty to get involved in some 'lowly' activities or associate with some individuals who do not fit in your highly exalted calibre.

There are people who cannot be seen to speak or associate with others simply because their

egos spell that on them. Though these men or women might be too beneath your exalted station, they may be who you need for the next level of your elevation in your business or career.

Take Home: Ask until you learn where you stand, this may help you understand your ranking. This will reveal to you the people you

need to be elevated into greater places.

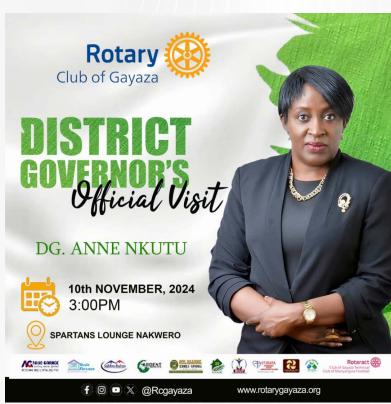
