He outlined three "essential pillars" for growth: innovation, continuity, partnership.

Innovating while also building a consistent legacy

Noting how quickly the world changes, de Camargo urged members to innovate.

"Technology, social expectations, economic conditions evolve constantly, and Rotary must evolve with them," he said. "Innovation is how we adapt to this changing world."

One important way to do this, de Camargo said, is by embracing and promoting a variety of club models. Satellite clubs, cause-based clubs, enterprise clubs, and passport clubs offer people different ways to experience Rotary. Noting that his wife helped charter a satellite club with nearly 50 members, he said, "Future Rotary members are out there. We must meet them where

they are."

De Camargo also emphasized the importance of leadership continuity and said he observed its benefits during his extensive travels in the past 18 months. Districts thrive, he said, when governors build on their predecessors' efforts, ensuring that programs and strategies continue without interruption.

He cited an effort to build wells in Nigeria, an initiative in Pakistan that helped people affected by devastating floods to find a better future, and a Rotary grant-funded program in India where children get lifesaving care.

"Continuity is not about uniformity; it's about alignment," de Camargo said. "When district leaders work together, envisioning Rotary beyond their 'governor year,' they set the stage for long-term success."

The power of partnership

Rotary members working alone can achieve great things, de Camargo said, but collaborating with others makes it possible to change the world. He noted that Rotary's historic effort against polio has been undertaken with partners such as the Gates Foundation, the World Health Organization, and UNICEF. Without these partners, de Camargo said, Rotary couldn't have had the same impact. He suggested exploring other kinds of partnerships to attract members and revitalize clubs.

Partnering with business associations, professional organizations, and academic institutions can help Rotary attract members while embracing diversity in professions and perspectives, he said. "By reaching out to professionals who share our values of service and engagement, we can expand Rotary's capacity to do good in the world."

Ultimately, de Camargo said, all of Rotary's achievements and growth depend on members. By focusing on attracting and retaining them, Rotary can renew its strength as well as its ability to create change in communities for years to come.

"In a world often divided, Rotary stands as a beacon of unity and hope," de Camargo said. "Our projects bring together people of all races, religions, genders, ideologies, and economic backgrounds, uniting us in a shared purpose: to do good in the world. ... Let's build a Rotary that unites for good and ensures a brighter future for all."

THE POWER OF MEMBERS

Rotary International President-elect Mário César Martins de Camargo asked members to Unite for Good by embracing growth, service, and connection as he outlined a plan to expand "the best-qualified team of volunteers on the planet."

"Rotary's greatest asset is not our history, our projects, or even our unmatched global reach. It is our members," de Camargo said at the organization's International Assembly in Orlando, Florida, USA, on 10 February. He noted praise from one of Rotary's partners about "the extraordinary dedication" of Rotary members. "That recognition from an outsider deepened my understanding: Rotary's greatest gift to the world is its people."

De Camargo, a member of the Rotary Club of Santo André, São Paulo, Brazil, emphasized the importance

of seeking out new perspectives and strengthening Rotary's service to communities around the globe.

s my tour of duty comes to an end, I must say it has been an enlightening and fulfilling experience and the year has gone by so fast! I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for entrusting me with leading the Rotary Club of Kampala Naalya.

I'm so honoured to have served this year, especially under the theme "The Magic of Rotary" and more so as the President of the District Governors Club.

I am grateful for the support that I have received from all of you members of this club and the connections with fellow Magical Presidents and other Rotarians. I am thankful to the Board and officers who have supported and served unreservedly.

This year has been the 2nd year of implementation of the Club's 3-year Strategic plan and I am proud for what we have been able to accomplish together as a club some of which I'll mention below.

Membership – We inducted six new members and we have a few more to add before the year ends. We have also had several member engagement activities through the Family of Rotary, fun fellowships, home hospitalities, membership surveys and other social events.

We had two of our members graduate for the Rotary Leadership Institute, several members participate in the Cancer Run, 23 members attend the

District Conference in Jinja and about 10 members will be going for the Rotary International convention in Calgary.

- The Rotary Foundation We have surpassed both our annual fund and polio plus targets and raised USD 11,304 and USD 771 respectively against targets of USD 10,000 and USD 500. This is the highest the club has given since its inception. Two of our members became Major donors, four became PHF plus and also recorded three New PHFs. - Service projects In partnership with RedOak Group Ltd we donated items worth 3.5 million Shillings to The Missionaries of the Poor. We also continued work on our existing projects e.g. we planted 65 fruit trees at St Mbaaga Tuzinde Kiwatule Primary School, and also set up the maize garden in Zirobwe to improve the student's nutrition under the Boy Empowerment Project.

In addition, project proposal work has continued on the projects we are proposing for Global grants i.e. Support for Adolescents in Ghetto Communities Project and the Kamuli Teenage mothers skilling project.

Reflecting a rich diversity in gender, ethnicity, age, religion, and professions, the club meets every Tuesday at 7:00 PM at the Ndere Cultural Centre, along the Kisaasi-Kyanja Road.

Over the last 13 years, The Rotary Club of Kampala-Naalya has undertaken various initiatives aligned with Rotary International's seven areas of focus namely: Peace Building and Conflict Prevention, Disease Prevention and Treatment, Water and Sanitation, Maternal Child Health,



Basic Education and Literacy, Economic and Community Development, and conservation of the Environment.

Below is an overview of some of the club's significant projects and Initiatives

1. Peace and Literacy (PAL) **Computer Project**

The Rotary Club of Kampala-Naalya initiated the Peace and Literacy (PAL) Computer Project to address Basic education and literacy shortfalls in Akwang Secondary Schools, Agago District Northern Uganda. This initiative aims to enhance educational opportunities and promote peace in post-conflict communities by providing computer literacy and resources to the youth.

The Club has so far constructed and furnished a computer Lab which now requires 30 computers to be fully operational. We hope that with this lab, the club initiative will help to bridge the educational divide and foster socio-economic development.

2. Addressing Mental Health **Challenges in Communities**

The Rotary Club of Kampala-Naalya has embarked on a project to tackle mental health challenges in selected communities, particularly in the Nakawa Division. The project is based on the fact that Uganda's primary care system is inadequately funded and illequipped to address mental health concerns in our communities.

In collaboration with medical personnel from Butabika Hospital, the club plans to implement schoolbased Early Intervention Programs to identify and support students facing mental health issues early on and run Mental Health Clinics and Shelters to offer community support and psychosocial services for individuals across all age groups.

The club will also run Community Care Units to provide services that bridge the gap between hospital care and community support, aiming to reduce stigma and enable individuals with mental illnesses to live successfully within their communities. These interventions are designed to improve mental

health literacy, reduce stigma, and provide accessible care to underserved populations.

3. Water and Sanitation Interventions

The Rotary Club of Kampala-Naalya has undertaken projects focused on implementing systems to supply safe drinking water to communities lacking this essential resource and constructing and improving sanitation infrastructure to ensure hygienic conditions, thereby reducing the incidence of waterborne diseases.

The first project was a partnership with the Rotary Club of Kampala which saw the construction of rock catchment reservoirs in Akwang village, an area with a rocky topography and limited access to water. Here more than 1,500 residents shared one borehole and an open well with domestic animals; a problem that needed an urgent and multifaceted solution to provide safe water and protect the community from diseases.

A needs assessment conducted by the partners established that with several rocks characterizing the topography of Agago, even low and erratic showers could supply large volumes of water provided the rock area is sufficiently large enough to compensate for the low rainfall. A system was designed and built such that run-off water from the surface of a rock outcrop is channelled through gutters to a 100,000-litre ferrocement tank. Before it reaches the tank, the water is passed through a filtration chamber filled with sand and stones, and connected to a tap stand.

4. RI-USAID Partnership for Schools in Northern Uganda

The second intervention under the Water and Sanitation area of Focus is the RI-USAID partnership which works to enhance access to safe water, improve hygiene behaviours in 44 schools and 18 healthcare facilities and strengthen district water and sanitation governance for sustainable services. The project benefits about 17,600 learners and 27,000 people from

the nearby trading centres to the health centres.

The WASH interventions by the Rotary Club of Kampala-Naalya included the construction of a 5-Stance Boys Drainable Latrine Block at Atenge Primary School, A 5-Stance Girls Drainable Latrine Block at Atenge and Agelech Primary Schools, a Group Handwashing Facility at Atenge, Agelech, Arum, Ayika, and Acholpii Lapono Primary Schools. The Club also supported the construction of incinerators at Arum, Ayika and Acholpii Lapono Primary Schools, all in Agago District

5. Environment Conservation

In a bid to promote ecological balance and protect the environment, the Rotary Club of Kampala-Naalya is part of the Plant Your Balance campaign, an initiative that is part of a multidistrict effort commemorating 100 years of Rotary in Africa.

The campaign's objective is for each Rotary club to calculate the number of trees to plant subtracting their years of existence from 100 and multiplying the balance by 100. For Kampala-Naalya, this results in a target of 8,800 trees over three years and this Rotary year we have focussed the activities in institutions; St. Mbaaga Tuziinde Primary School in Kiwatule and New Hope Charity School in Kamuli District.

6. Youth **Empowerment** through **Business Skills** Training

Under the Every Youth Working Initiative (Global Grant Number 2230212), which sought to address the youth unemployment challenge, by supporting young people to have a proper attitude that will help them to get employed or develop their entrepreneurial skills, the Rotary Club of Kampala-Naalya adopted a community in Kamuli District.

Through the Programme, more than 20 youths were taught

the art of making craft shoes and bar soap. Their products are now on the market. Often, the club holds motivational talks with the youths, to provide inspiration but also empower them with the knowledge, skills and attitude for overcoming generational challenges.

Out of the intervention, the club also sanctioned a school programme that sought to support the less privileged children born of teenage mothers and farmers in Kiyunga and neighbouring villages. The school's model heavily depends on well-wishers' donations and sponsorships for fees and educational materials. Today, the school program has up to 203 learners.

The Club is now conducting a needs assessment to magically change the lives of learners in Kamuli through the School Program.

7. The celebration of Women in Rotary

Every year, the Rotary Club of Kampala Naalya organizes an annual Women in Rotary Dinner to coincide with the International Women's Day celebrations. The annual event which brings together women and men from different walks of life is aligned with Rotary International's Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) policy.

This event aims to:

- Highlight the roles and achievements of women in Rotary.
- Promote Rotary's mission and values to women groups.
- Inspire women to join Rotary and participate in service projects.
- Recruit more women into Rotary service.
- Fundraise for Rotary causes.

Service Projects Profile

Project 1: Mind Matters: Mental Health Support for Adolescents in Acholi Quarters

Rotary Focus Area; Disease Prevention and Treatment

Project Description

he "Mental-Health Support for Adolescents in Ghetto Communities (MSAG)" is a two-year initiative in collaboration with Butabika National Referral Mental Hospital and the Uganda Network of Young People Living with HIV and AIDS (UNYPA). It targets adolescents aged 12-17 in Acholi Quarters, Nakawa Division, Kampala, to improve mental well-being and educational outcomes.

Key Beneficiaries

- **Primary**: 600 adolescents (350 female, 250 male) aged 12-17, including those living with HIV/AIDS, in and out of school in Acholi Quarters.
- **Secondary**: Teachers, health workers, parents, and local leaders.

Budget: \$59,211.50

Project 2: Digital Dreams: Enhancing Digital Literacy in Agago and Masaka

Focus Area; Basic Education and Literacy

Project Description

This project will equip Akwang Secondary School (Agago) and Masaka School for the Deaf with 25 computers each to establish functional computer labs, enhancing digital literacy.

Key Beneficiaries

- **Primary**: Over 650 students at Akwang Secondary School and 133 students at Masaka School for the Deaf.
- **Secondary**: Teachers and surrounding communities benefiting from skilled graduates.

Budget: \$27,266





Project 3.1: Building Hope: New Hope Charity Junior School Adoption in Kamuli

Focus Area; Basic Education and Literacy, Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH)

Project Description

New Hope Charity Junior School in Bugumira, Kamuli District, serves 201 pupils (118 girls, 83 boys) but operates with inadequate infrastructure. The school has seven muddy, semi-permanent classrooms, with three additional classrooms needed by 2026 for Primary 7. There is no on-site clean water, limited sanitation, and no proper administration office. Girls miss school during menstruation (70% absenteeism) due to a lack of sanitary pads and incinerators (Needs Assessment Report, 2024). Poverty and lack of scholastic materials contribute to high dropout rates.

This project will transform New Hope Charity Junior School through infrastructure and WASH improvements.

Key Beneficiaries

- **Primary**: 201 pupils (118 girls, 83 boys) and future Primary 7 students.
- **Secondary**: Teachers, parents, and the Bugumira community.

Budget: \$49,000



Focus Area; Economic and Community Development, Maternal and Child Health

Project Description

Teenage pregnancy in Kamuli District drives school dropout and economic dependency, with 17 interviewed teenage mothers citing financial constraints, childcare needs, and stigma as barriers (Needs Assessment Report, 2024). Uganda's teenage pregnancy rate is 25% (UBOS, 2024), among the highest in Sub-Saharan Africa. Only 3 of 17 mothers knew about family planning, and health issues like C-section complications and poor nutrition are prevalent, affecting maternal and child health. This two-year project, in collaboration with EGOLI Africa, will empower 25 teenage mothers through vocational training and financial support.

Key Beneficiaries

• **Primary**: 25 teenage mothers in Kamuli.

 Secondary: Their children, families, and the community through economic contributions.

Budget: \$41,665

Project 3.3: Clean and Confident: WASH Facilities for St. Andrew's Secondary School, Kamuli

Focus Area -Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH), Basic Education and Literacy

Project Description

St. Andrew's Secondary School in Bukaaya 1A, Kamuli, serves 161 students (96 girls, 65 boys) but lacks adequate WASH facilities. Substandard pit latrines without doors, no handwashing stations, and a lack of sanitary pads cause girls to miss school during menstruation (70% absenteeism)

(Kamuli Needs Assessment, 2024). These conditions, coupled with poverty and early pregnancies, contribute to high dropout rates.

This project will enhance WASH facilities and leadership at St. Andrew's Secondary School.

Key Beneficiaries

- **Primary**: 161 students (96 girls, 65 boys).
- **Secondary**: Teachers, staff, and the Bukaaya community.

Budget: \$7500

Project 4: Skills for Success: Training for Street Adolescents

Focus Area; Economic and Community Development

Project Description

Street adolescents in Kampala face extreme poverty and limited job opportunities, contributing to social exclusion and crime. Uganda has over 15,000 street children, with 60% in urban areas like Kampala (UNICEF, 2023). Lack of skills leads to unemployment and vulnerability, necessitating vocational training for self-reliance. This project will provide vocational training for 50 street adolescents in Kampala.

Key Beneficiaries

- **Primary**: 50 street adolescents (aged 14-18) in Kampala.
- Secondary: Local communities through reduced crime and economic activity.

Budget: \$20,000

Project 5: Leading the Way: Girls' Leadership Training in Nakivale Refugee Camp

Focus Area; Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution, Basic Education and Literacy **Project Description**

Girls in Nakivale Refugee Camp face barriers to empowerment, including limited education and leadership opportunities. Uganda hosts over 1.5 million refugees, with Nakivale accommodating 180,000 (UNHCR, 2024). Only 30% of refugee girls complete secondary education due to early marriage and genderbased violence (ŬNHCR, 2023). Leadership training can empower girls to overcome these challenges. This project will provide leadership and life skills training for 30 girls in Nakivale.

Key Beneficiaries

Primary: 30 girls (aged 14-18) in Nakivale Refugee Camp.

Secondary: Families and the refugee community through ripple effects.

Budget: \$15,000 (estimated).

Project 6: Empowering the Poor: Missionaries of the Poor Economic Development

Rotary Focus Area; Economic and Community Development

Project Description

The Missionaries of the Poor Bethlehem Children's Home in Busega supports 106 vulnerable children, many with disabilities, but relies on donations due to limited income-generating capacity. Poverty affects 21% of Uganda's population, with urban areas like Busega facing high unemployment (UBOS, 2024). Sustainable income sources are critical to providing food, medical care, and education. This project will support vocational skills and income-generating activities for the Missionaries of the Poor.

Key Beneficiaries

- **Primary**: 106 children and staff at Bethlehem Children's Home.
- **Secondary**: The Busega community through economic activity.

Budget: \$5,000.
