Arezzo Francesco of Italy selected to be 2025-26 Rotary International President

Francesco Arezzo, a member of the Rotary Club of Ragusa, Italy, has been selected by the Board of Directors to become Rotary International's president for 2025-26.

Arezzo will become president on 1 July. The Board conducted a special session following the unexpected resignation of RI President-elect Mário César Martins de Camargo on 8 June. Guided by the RI code and policies, the Board selected the new president-elect from a pool of candidates who were considered by the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International in August 2023.

The 2025-26 presidential message, announced at the 2025 Rotary International Assembly in February, will remain Unite for Good, which calls on Rotary members to be a force for unity in a world increasingly divided by politics, geography, and ideology. Through service projects, Rotary brings together people of every background — across races, religions, and professions — in a shared mission to do good in their communities.

Arezzo is an orthodontist in private practice. He is active internationally as a member of the Italian, European, and American orthodontic associations. He is vice president of the National Association of Italian Dentists for the province of Ragusa and was the founder and head for seven years of the delegation for Ragusa of the National Trust for Italy. He is a Knight of Honour and Devotion in Obedience within the Sovereign Order of Malta.

A Rotary member for more than 30 years, Arezzo has served as vice chair of the Joint Strategic Planning Committee and as RI director, learning facilitator, and district conference presidential representative.

Resignation

What Happens When a Rotary International President-Elect Resigns?

In an unprecedented but not unfamiliar turn of events, the Rotary International President-elect for 2025–26, Mário Cesar Martins de Camargo of Brazil, formally resigned from his position. Camargo cited health challenges, increased business obligations, and pressing family matters as reasons behind his decision.

“It was not my will, but I was forced to do so for health, business and family reasons. I hope to count on the support of Rotarians in this difficult time and I wish you success in your mission,” - Mário Cesar Martins de Camargo said in the announcement which was made last week.

His statement has left many Rotarians asking: What happens now? Who steps in? Is Rotary prepared for this?

Although rare, Rotary International has clear, well-established bylaws to handle such leadership transitions, ensuring governance, continuity, and stability remain intact. According to Rotary International Bylaws (Section 6.080), here's what happens:

6.080.1 If the President-elect resigns before the next Convention (And in this case, the convention is less than a week away) The Nominating Committee for President is re-engaged to select a new nominee for the year in question. This selection is made at the next scheduled meeting, an emergency meeting, or even through ballot-by-mail or rapid communication methods. The process is designed to be efficient and typically concluded within 30 days to maintain momentum.

Following Camargo's resignation, The RI Board of Directors is now revisiting the original slate of candidates considered during the last nominating cycle. As part of the process, all eligible candidates who

submitted their names for consideration by the Nominating Committee for RI President will be contacted by the general secretary and asked whether they wish to be considered for selection. No other candidates will be considered for selection by the committee.

If the time before the Convention is too short for full procedural steps (As is the case this time), nominations can be made from the Convention floor. If all goes well, the new President-elect will be formally introduced and ceremonially equipped with the instruments of leadership at the upcoming Rotary International Convention in Calgary, Canada.

This isn't the first time Rotary has navigated such a leadership curve-ball. In 2019, Rotarian Sushil Gupta of India who was then President-nominee for 2020–21 resigned due to deteriorating health. His heartfelt resignation struck a chord with Rotarians globally:

“It was my dream to serve as your president, but my health prevents me from giving my absolute best to you and the office of the president... Rotary deserves nothing less,” he said in his



communication.

Gupta's resignation was met with understanding and grace. In his place, the Nominating Committee selected Holger Knaack of Germany, who went on to lead Rotary International with distinction through the global COVID-19 pandemic during the 2020–21 Rotary year.

A year earlier, Rotary International had found itself in the unusual position of seeking another individual to lead the humanitarian service organization after the sudden death of RI President-elect Sam Frobisher Owori, just two weeks into his term as Rotary International president-elect. Then aged 75, Sam Owori, died after complications from leg surgery in Texas.

Barry Rassin, of the Rotary Club of East Nassau, New Providence, Bahamas, was later selected by the Nominating Committee as a replacement, a moment that reinforced a powerful truth: Rotary's strength is not just in its leaders, but in its systems, structures, and shared values.

Roles of the RI President

The Rotary International President leads a vast international organization with 1.4 million volunteers worldwide, requiring significant oversight, decision-making, and communication. One of their key roles is to set the

direction and strategic goals for the organization, which requires careful planning, goal setting, and action plan development.

The President presides over the Rotary International Board of Directors, which sets policies for the organization. They also likely interact with numerous committees and leaders from around the world and often travel extensively to visit clubs and districts and attend international events. This involves public speaking engagements and representing Rotary on a global stage, including presiding over all conventions and other international RI meetings.

Who Is Eligible to Become RI President?

Rotary International maintains strict eligibility standards for the highest office:

- Only Past RI Directors may serve as President.
- Presidents are selected by a 17-member Presidential Nominating Committee composed of elected Past RI Directors from half of the global zones (which alternate annually).
- Current RI Board members are not eligible.
- Most successful candidates have also served as committee chairs, and trustees, or held senior leadership roles at district, regional, and international levels.

Most RI Presidents have climbed through multiple leadership roles before nomination:

- At the District Level, they have served as District Governors, committee chairs for membership, public image, or The Rotary Foundation.
- At the Regional Level, they have served as Regional Coordinators, Public Image Champions, and Foundation Advisers, while at the international level, they have served as Trustees, Institute trainers, GETS faculty, and committee members.

This layered leadership journey ensures that when called upon, RI Presidents are deeply grounded in Rotary values, global exposure, and institutional knowledge. It is also worth noting that the Role of Rotary International President is demanding and multifaceted with responsibilities that inherently involve a significant workload.

The launch was also attended by District Governors-Elect Geoffrey Kitakule (D9213) and Christine Kawooya (D9214), District Governor Nominee Daniel Damulira (D9214), legal representative Counsel Lubogo D from Rotary Uganda Ltd, Past District Governors Stephen Mwanje (also Chair of the Rotary Cancer Run), Xavier Sentamu, and PDG Mike Sebalu, Chair of the Rotarians Uganda SACCO Board.

Steven Lubowa, Head of Marketing and Distribution at Old Mutual, highlighted the digital ease of the product, stating:

Patrick Kimathi, the Managing Director at Old Mutual Life Assurance Uganda, described the partnership as a milestone in aligning insurance with community service.

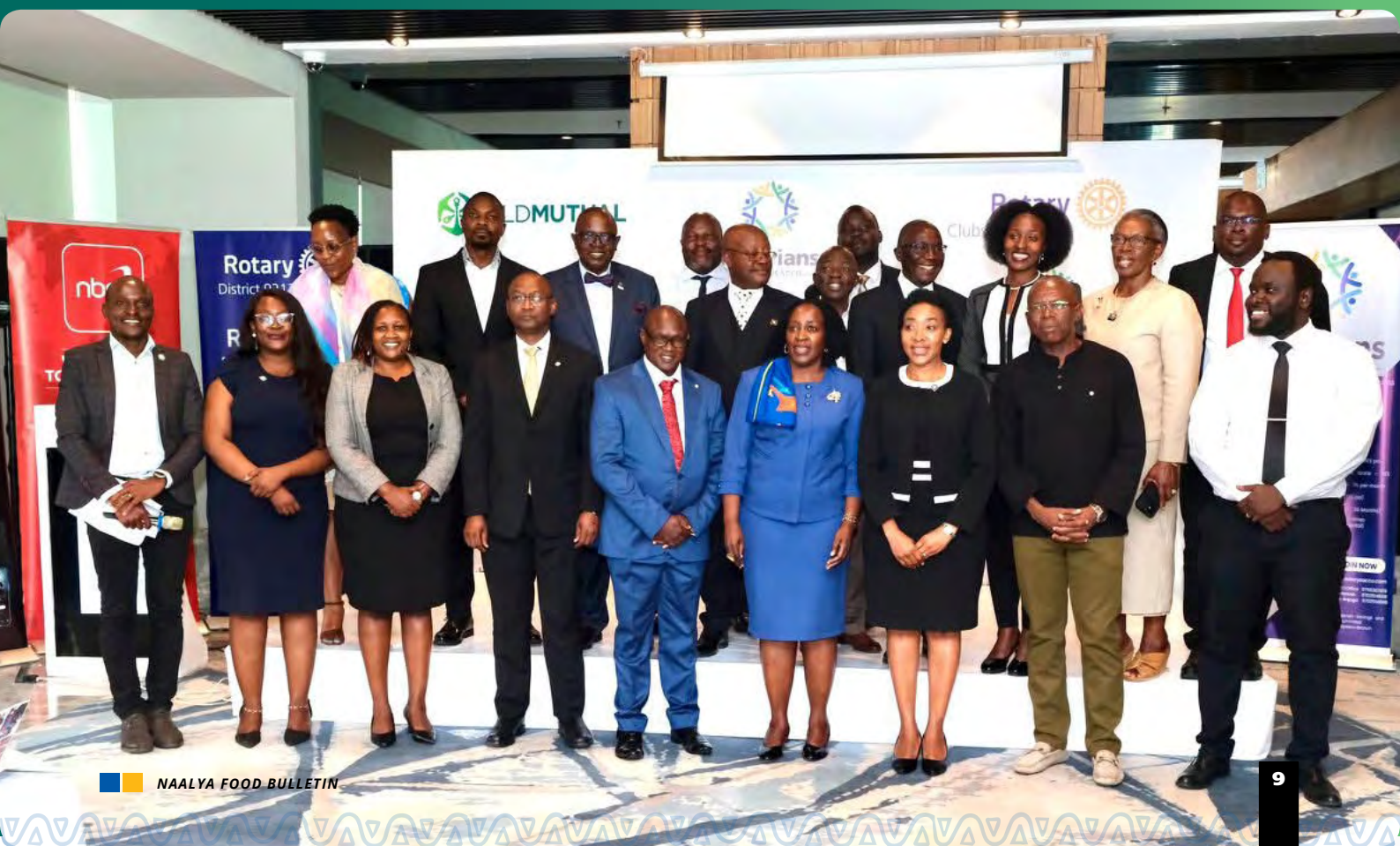
"Today, we don't just launch a product. We join Rotary in its mission to create lasting change in communities."

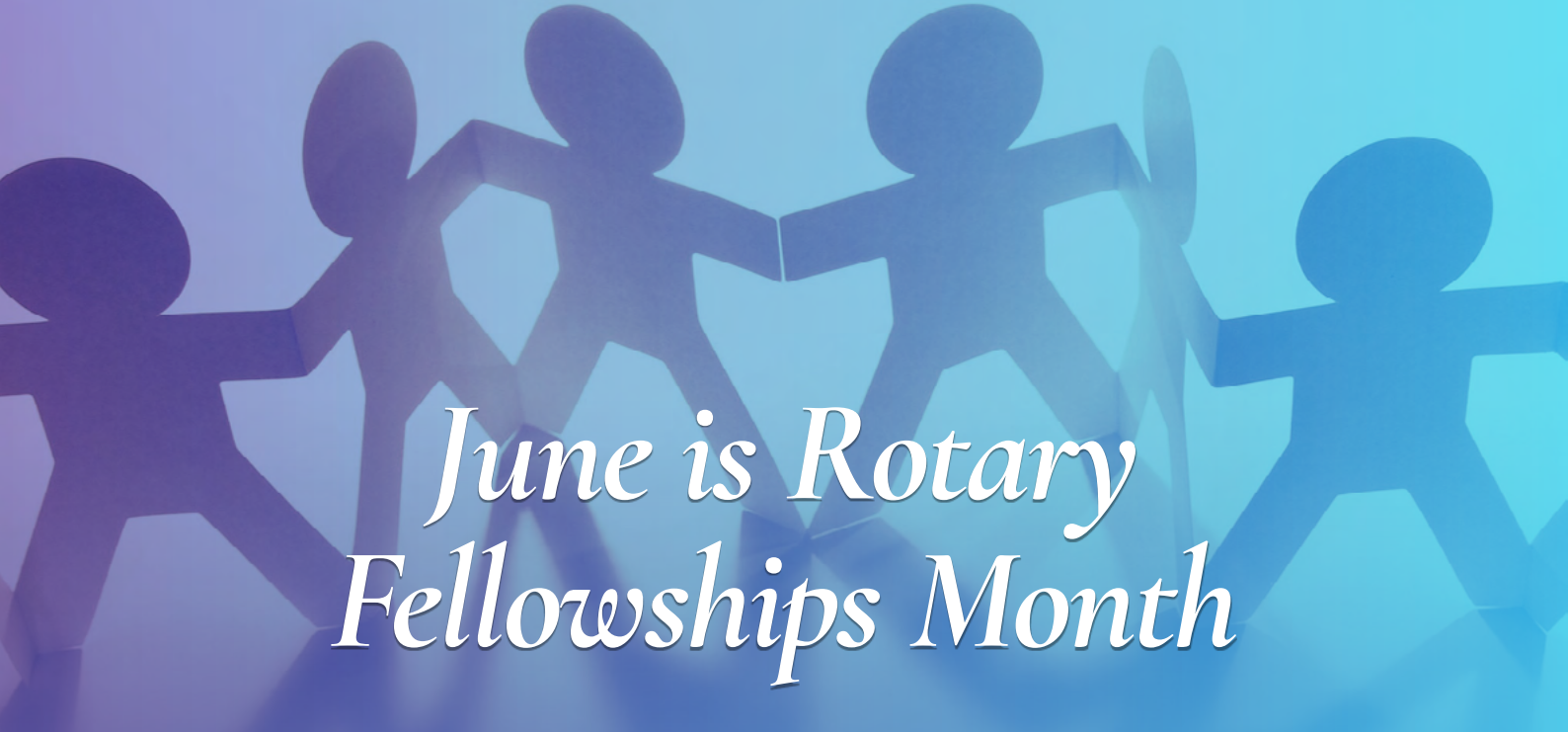
spirit of voluntarism is ever awake hence a drive to self-satisfaction.

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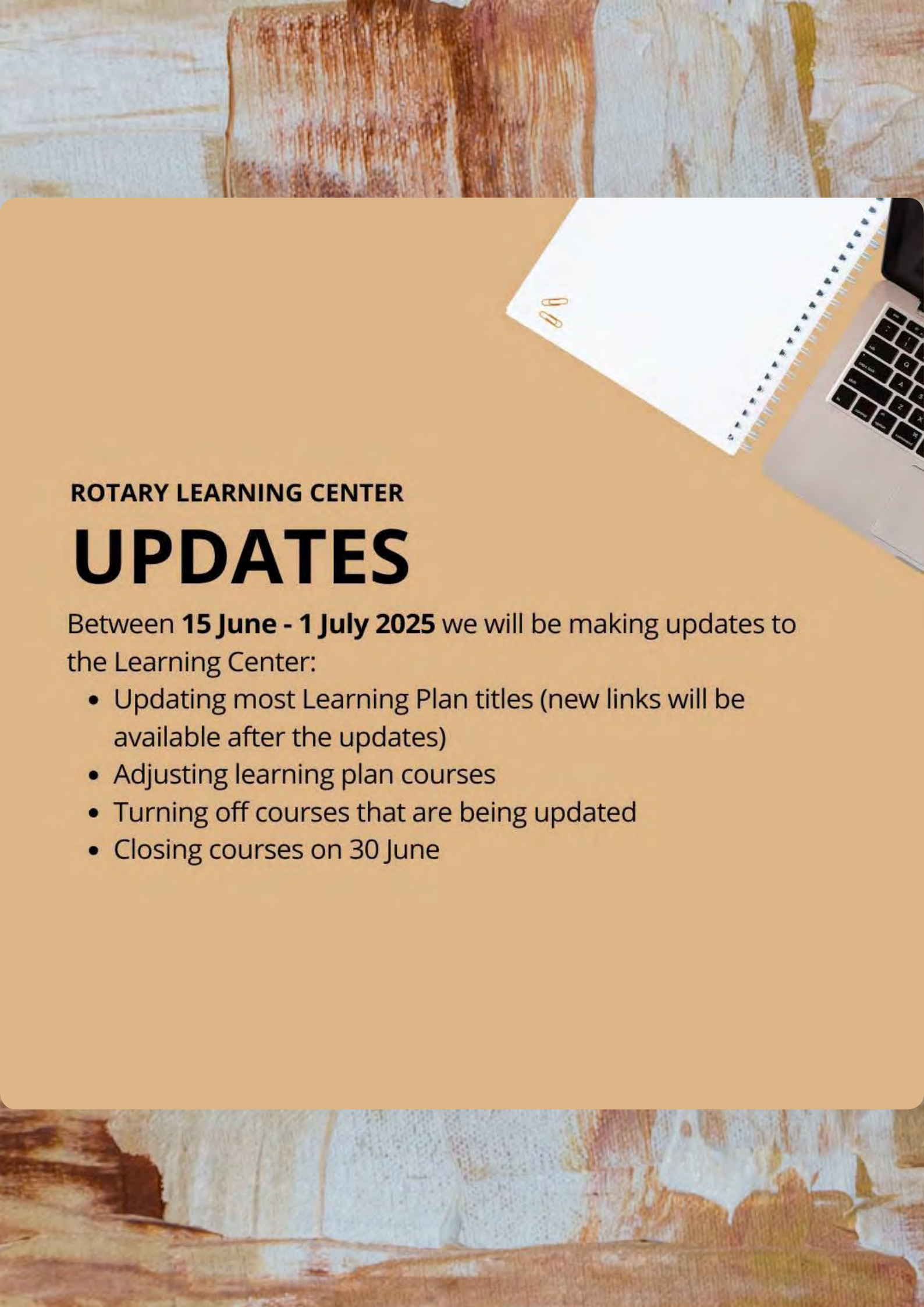

Fun Facts

Do you know why America is called America?

The name **America** is full of history and exploration and goes back to a lesser known Italian explorer, Amerigo Vespucci. While Christopher Columbus gets credit for “discovering” the New World, it’s Vespucci’s name that is on the continents of North and South America.

In the early 1500s, Amerigo Vespucci went on voyages to the New World. Unlike Columbus, Vespucci realized the lands he was exploring were not part of Asia as everyone believed, but entirely new continents. This was a big deal in reshaping the European understanding of geography at the time.

The name “America” first appeared on a map by German cartographer Martin Waldseemüller in 1507. Waldseemüller and his team were influenced by Vespucci’s letters where he described his voyages and observations of the New World. They believed Vespucci was the first to identify these lands as a new continent and decided to honour him by naming the territory “America” using the Latin version of his first name, Americus.

At first “America” only referred to South America. Over time, it would expand to include both North and South America as more of the continents were explored. Interestingly, Vespucci himself may not have known about this naming decision as he died in 1512 just a few years after the name first appeared.

Why “America” and not “Columbia” might seem strange today, but it was the influence of Vespucci’s letters at that time in history. The name has stuck and represents discovery, exploration, and the Age of Exploration. So next time you hear “America” you can thank Amerigo Vespucci and a cartographer ahead of his time.

Family Matters

Luke 12:27 (KJV): Consider the lilies how they grow: they toil not, they spin not; and yet I say unto you, that Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.

THE GLORY OF GOD'S PROVISIONS

The transformative phrase is "Consider the lilies," This thought invites us into a deeper place through which to perceive and understand the divine principle that governs the growth of lilies.

The Greek word translated "toil" in is *kopiaō*, which means to labor with wearisome effort, to grow weary and exhausted.

This draws a contrast analogy between the lilies and Solomon's raiment. Although King Solomon had everything at his disposal—wealth, wisdom, and human craftsmanship—his attire could not compare to the natural beauty with which God made clothes for the lilies. This is the glory by which nature makes provision through the sovereignty of the creator.
